

PLEASE NOTE: • This is for general application and cannot address every specific situation / circumstance - to that extent we suggest getting additional guidance from the local building department or CILB.

- Registered contractors are only allowed to do work in the county the license was issued in (unless other counties have reciprocity allowing your license to be valid in their area).
- Specialty licenses = only licensed in specific phase of construction and can only contract with a licensed commercial, residential or service contractor (with service, only renovations) (no homeowner or GC unless Jim Walters exemption applies). If licensed in all seven specialties, you cannot build a pool from start to finish. You would need to work under the supervision of a registered or certified commercial or residential pool contractor.
- An electrical contractor's license is required to perform any electrical work more involved than simply inserting a power cord into an electrical outlet.

^{**} Gas hook up requires a Category I LP gas dealer, LP gas installer or specialty installer (if within their specifics) license. Also need license to sell equipment for the use of LP gas.
